San Marino to Implement the IMF's Enhanced General Data Dissemination System

A joint mission by the International Monetary Fund (IMF) visited San Marino during October 22–30, 2019, to assist the authorities with the implementation of the Enhanced General Data Dissemination System (e-GDDS). This system aims to improve the publication of official macroeconomic data for the country, notably via the National Summary Data Page (NSDP). The NSDP will be posted on the Information Technology, Data and Statistics Office's web site utilizing the Statistical Data and Metadata Exchange (SDMX). The NSDP page contains links to statistics published by official data producers, namely the Information Technology, Data and Statistics Office, the Central Bank of San Marino and the Ministry of Finance and Budget. The page aims to serve as a one-stop publication vehicle for essential macroeconomic data.

Publication of essential macroeconomic data through the NSDP will provide national policy makers and domestic and international stakeholders, including investors and rating agencies, with easy access to information that the IMF's Executive Board has identified as critical for monitoring economic and financial developments in the country. Making this information easily accessible in both human and machine-readable formats, in one place and according to an Advance Release Calendar, will allow all users to have simultaneous access to timely data and will bring greater data transparency.

The NSDP will be made public before end-January 2020 and will give users access to comprehensive macroeconomic data for San Marino. A link to the NSDP will be included on the IMF's Dissemination Standard Bulletin Board (DSBB), which can be accessed here: <https://dsbb.imf.org>.

Background

The e-GDDS was established by the IMF's Executive Board in May 2015 replacing the GDDS, which was established in 1997, to support improved data transparency, encourage statistical development, and help create synergies between data dissemination and surveillance.
